## 4 PILLARS OF COUNTERFEITING





- Counterfeit automotive parts: brakes, filters, airbags, tires...
   compromising user safety.
- Fake oils and lubricants: affecting engine performance and potentially causing severe breakdowns.
- Counterfeit equipment and tools: potentially affecting productivity and the reliability of industrial machinery.



- Counterfeit luxury clothing and bags: imitations of major brands sold through parallel channels.
- Watches, jewelry, shoes and accessories: made with lower-quality materials, often without certification.



- Counterfeit medications: absence of active ingredients or presence of toxic substances.
- Counterfeit pesticides and chemical products: impacting agriculture and endangering the food chain.
- Counterfeit hygiene and health products: made without tests or safety standards.



- IPTV and audiovisual piracy: illegal streaming of TV channels, movies, and series without a license.
- Pirated movies, music, and software: available for illegal download or streaming.
- Identity theft and fake communications: fake websites, phishing, and cybercrime.



CABINET MAP




# The College of Experts of the Greater Maghreb














### Main road axis and Borders









## Executive Decree: The Algerian Government Publishes Executive Decree No. 23-417 to Strengthen the Fight Against Counterfeiting

• This decree establishes the conditions and procedures for the destruction by the customs administration of seized, confiscated, or abandoned goods.

• This measure is part of ongoing efforts to strengthen the protection of intellectual property rights and combat illicit trade.

• It should be noted that the cost of destruction is borne by the counterfeiter, which is a significant advancement.



#### 12 Specialized Intellectual Property (IP) Courts:

A major breakthrough will now allow IP cases to be handled by specialized courts dedicated to this field.

This new system aims to make all procedures related to IP matters—including infringement, copyright, and case management—more:

- Straightforward
- Cost-effective
- Efficient

To further enhance the framework, it is essential to implement a continuous training program and develop a clear understanding of the challenges, impacts, and objectives to be achieved.
